- Present cases and ask questions to the interdisciplinary team (Hub) and other primary care providers (Spokes) via videoconferencing

Why COVID19 Child Behavioral Health ECHO?

- Project ECHO is offering a short series to help practices address the impact of COVID19 on staff, patients and practice management.
- Children often use primary care providers for behavioral health management, and this may be increasing during this unique time.
- We aim to focus on <u>PROBLEM SOLVING</u> the common issues faced by primary care practices through collaborative learning approach.
